Prior to the meeting commencing the Chairman invited the following people to address the meeting: There being no public attending the meeting, the Chairman opened the meeting.

Minutes of the Monkokehampton Parish Council Meeting that took place on Wednesday 14th September 2022 at 7.30 pm in the Old School Room.

Before the start of the meeting the Chairman read out The Proclamation for Parish and Town Councils. This is to remember our Queen Elizabeth the Second and to acknowledge the passing of the crown to her son Charles. The Accession Council met at St James's palace to proclaim the new sovereign and cause it to be read in areas of their jurisdiction. The High Sheriff of Devon discharged that duty and now the Chairman brings this proclamation to the residents of Monkokehampton.

- 1. To receive apologies for absence and consider if the reason for the absence should be formally approved by the council: none
- 2. To receive any Declarations of Interest from members: Councillors are reminded to declare any personal or prejudicial interests they may have in any agenda items: none declared
- 3. To receive the Minutes of the Previous Meeting held on Wednesday July 6th 2022: Copies of which have been previously circulated to members and are to be agreed and signed by the Chairman as a true record of the previous meeting held on July 6th 2022. These were approved and the minutes signed.
- 4. Report by West Devon Borough Councillor:

There is a lot of hardship for low-income families because of the rise in food, fuel, council tax etc. plus the housing crisis doesn't help. WDBC do have a hardship fund to help these families. Councils can give advice to these people i.e., teachers, vicars and the council. They maybe identified by the school. In smaller places they may have some idea of who might be in need and be able to offer support. It was pointed out that older retired people have less money coming in and if on a basic pension are probably struggling. Some workers pay has increased a bit. It was suggested that older people could teach youngsters how to be economical and less wasteful. A question was raised asking what influence WDBC has in schools. There is no formal way and teaching is very different these days and a lot of money is being ploughed into education. The ultimate control is by DCC. As regard Okehampton Station they hope to build a new station and car park. Some money has been promised by government - £47m for Okehampton Railway. The government is trying to level up areas. There maybe a planning office in Okehampton again as they are thinking of separating the planners into South Hams and West Devon as it used to be.

- 6.3 Tavistock to Plymouth Railway reopening: This does not affect this area. Also the Tavistock line was completely destroyed so would be expensive to reinstate.
- 6.4 Civility and Respect: to agree that councillors, clerks and members of the public will work with civility and respect in their roles.
- 6.5 Okehampton District Community Transport Group: after much discussion it was agreed to donate £50. This will be completed at the next meeting.

- 9.4 There was a suggestion about placing a defibulator in the kiosk but as the kiosk has no access to power this cannot happen.

- 9.6 Cars are parking on the kerb again irrespective of the danger this can cause.
- 9.7 There are lots of weeds again and Councillor Smallacombe will try to arrange a clean up party on the 24th September.
